IN THE JUNIOR MATHS CHALLENGE

The **Junior Maths Challenge** is aimed at students in S1 and S2 across the UK. It consists of 25 challenging and interesting problems that encourage mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency and flexibility in applying mathematical techniques. You can find the paper here (and solutions here) if you would like to take a look at the problems.

About 90% of pupils who answered our survey answered that they were always or sometimes anxious before an exam. 51.1% said that they were always anxious.

MAKE A STUDY GROUP

This could be meeting up with friends for revision or assigning a free for a class, just before a big exam.



TAKE A BREAK

When you get really stressed out, take a break. Get away, go for a walk or listen to music - anything that can help you to get away from all the studying.

TALK TO SOMEONE

If you find it hard, talk to someone. This could be a friend, family member or a teacher.

PLAN IN ADVANCE

Plan what you are going to study in advance and create a study timetable. Make clear and visually pleasing notes, you can use different coloured pens for this. Once you've made your notes, copy them out again and tell family and friends everything you know about the subject. Recall the information in your own words.



FIND A PLACE TO STUDY

The ideal place for studying, would be a place that is calm and quiet, without distractions. This could be places like libraries, cafes or in the garden. Remember to take a 5-minute break every 45 minutes.


