

S3 - S4: ABINGDON BOOK QUIZ


Well done Europa!

Vendredi dernier, le temps de la restitution du club MUN (Model United Nations), au lycée Francoise de Tournefeuille, réunissait cinq délégations d'étudiants anglais (Europea School UK d'Oxford), italiens (Polo Civico Scolastico A. Manzoni Milan) et issus de lycées d'Occitanie (les lycées Théophile-Gauthier de Tarbes, Clémence-Royer de Fonsorbes et Nelson-Mandela de Pibrac). 220 élèves se sont ainsi rencontrés les 1^{er}, 2 et 3 février pour terminer ensemble lors d'une conférence, présentée par Bernadette Fiorina qui encadre le club chaque mercredi midi. Alors comme le disait, Jean Gasc,

« membre des MUN précédents : Pourquoi êtes-vous là ? » « Pour se faire des amis », a répondu aussitôt une participante, propos relevé par « des contacts oui, pour se faire une idée des organisations internationales, et autres raisons personnelles ». Car oui ce club est une authentique simulation de l'assemblée générale des Nations Unies et de ses comités et propose des débats en anglais sur diverses thématiques d'actualité : droits de l'Homme, environnement, économie et société, politique et histoire. Les objectifs de ce club sont de développer la pratique orale de

l'anglais, l'éducation à la citoyenneté et l'ouverture internationale. Créé en 2017 avec une quinzaine d'élèves autour de trois professeurs (Bernadette Fiorina, Eileen Piet, Nicolas Bounet), le club a institué la conférence qui a ceci de particulier qu'elle est entièrement animée par des élèves qui endossent le rôle de secrétaire général, et de président et vice-président de commission. Ces journées de conférences portant sur des résolutions avec l'apprentissage des compétences attendues d'un diplomate sont une extraordinaire formation pour les élèves.

Trinity College's academics and doctoral researchers have been part of a brilliant series of talks, *Trinity Beyond the Classroom*, offering super-curricular enrichment to secondary and sixth-form students at state schools since 2021 and we'd like *you* to be part of the third series in 2023.

Talks cover a wide range of subjects – for instance, Medicine, Social Sciences, Media, Chemistry, Biology, Physics and Engineering – and more talks will be announced once the series is underway on Tuesday 14 February. They are great examples of accessible super-curricular engagement, with the opportunity for students to engage, take part in polls, and ask questions live.


