

the 16 to 19 tuition fund 2021 to 2022 academic year

Europa School UK is eligible to receive £1611 from this fund for small group tuition, following the [guidance](#). A small group should be no more than five students for this purpose but in exceptional circumstances this may be extended to 7 students

The school has also deferred some of the funding it received in 2020-21 (£1698.64) to be used in this academic year. The reason for the deferral was the lack of time to deliver the catchup in the spring term and the need to focus on the delivery of our new end qualification, the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

Description of Support

The school has as its end qualification, The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Success in their level 3 qualification in English and Mathematics is therefore required for them to achieve the required standard in these subjects.

The 16-19 funding will provide Mathematics and English small group tuition across in year 13.

60 group sessions of 1 hour duration are planned to be delivered from November 2021 to March 2022. They will be divided equally across Year 12 and 13 for English Language and Mathematics.

The maximum group size is 5 students.

The students were identified from:

- Students from vulnerable groups
- Students receiving Pupil Premium.
- Students on the SEN register
- Students who did not obtain a level 4 at GCSE in English Language and/or Mathematics and identified from class councils as making insufficient progress during the remote provision during the lockdown in 2020.

By opting in to receive this funding, Europa School UK are agreeing to:

- produce a concise statement explaining how you will use this funding in line with our guidance to prioritise support for disadvantaged students.
- publish the statement on your website in the autumn term.
- record the use of the funding, including reference to the individual students that receive the support, the needs of those students, the number of hours of tuition delivered.
- retain the necessary evidence of:
 - the assessment of need
 - planned delivery.
 - the tuition provided.
 - the direct costs incurred.
- deliver the extra tuition and spend the associated funding in the 2021 to 2022 academic year.
- notify ESFA of any unspent funding from this fund for it to be reclaimed.
