






Design Ventura Mini Challenge

The girls were excited and confident about the fixture, as they knew they had a good squad and strong relationships throughout the team. The game started brightly with both teams displaying their intentions with fast attacking football. The Europa School opened their account with a beautiful through ball from Inka, which Jenna pounced on and calmly slotted past the keeper. Europa continued to exploit the space on the wings and drive the ball into dangerous positions. This allowed us to add another 2 before half time (Jenna and Megan) making the half time score 3-0. The opposition switched things around at the break, which allowed them to use their numerical advantage in midfield to good effect. Europa stayed strong and ended up seeing out the match 3-2.

Our round 2 opponents were The Bicester School and again we were drawn away. The Bicester School beat King Alfred's in the last round so we were aware of their evident quality. The Europa School started with purpose and played a controlled passing game, spreading the ball wide and making use of our strengths within the team. We worked hard as a defensive unit and managed to keep their talented players quiet and strike on the counter, when the opportunity arose. Unfortunately we could not hold them out for the duration of the match, so best of luck to The Bicester School going into the next round.

Sadly this means our run in the cup has come to an end, but I am immensely proud of the girls; their talent, their resilience and yet again showing what a great place The Europa School is.


