Combe Mill

S1 took a trip to Combe Mill for the first time this year. They had a wonderful experience learning about the social history of the workers, steam engines, waterwheels and watched blacksmith at work. Afterwards we enjoyed the rainy but beautiful countryside and learned how to measure circumferences of trees to enable carbon calculation. Interactors, who are 14 years and older, can do a great course called the Rotary Youth Leadership & Management Programme. It is endorsed by the Institute of Leadership Management and requires the course participants to plan, implement and review an Interact project, complete with full documentation and an official assessment. Participants are provided with a tutor who leads them through the main elements of leadership and project management.

Last year 5 Interactors did this course. They all passed and now they have a certificate from the ILM, which will look great on their CV.

Work Experience

Mrs Santova has sent out information regarding this year's work experience for S5 and S6 in September 2019. S5 will have 2 weeks of work experience (22/6/2020 – 3/7/2020) and S6 one week (22/6/2020 – 26/6/2020). This is a fantastic opportunity for our students to gain an insight into different areas of work that might be of interest; to develop workplace skills and increase self confidence. Please, bear in mind that the demand for work experience placements is high therefore we urge you to start searching as soon as possible in order to avoid disappointment. We also understand that it can be a challenge finding the right placement for your child so please do get in touch if you are struggling. We are starting to build up some community connections within school and may be able to help. Some students left their planning to the last minute last year and we were unable to help as effectively at that point. Please remember that the completed forms are due back on 29/05/2020 and you are very welcome to hand them back as soon as you have completed them and secured your experience. Students can access the forms on google classroom. We encourage students to take responsibility for arranging their work experience themselves, however your supervision is very much appreciated.
