S5 Skills Week

As we explained in our last newsletter, due to the current circumstances we have taken the decision to cancel work experience this year and we are replacing it with a Skills Week. Over half of the S5 year group have volunteered to take part in setting up this Skills Week and so, following our planning meeting last week, I would like to give you a little insight into our plans.

With support from Mrs Powell and Mrs Charalambous, S5 students have set out to create a skills week where different employers will provide interactive half day skills sessions throughout the week. We are hopeful that we will be able to encourage enough employers to work with us that students in S5 will be able to pick a different morning and afternoon session each day which reflects the interests and skills they wish to develop.

Some S5 students have already been lucky enough to gain skills in the planning stage as a group have worked on developing the logo, with Warren Brown from Brown Creative, which you will hopefully start to see in lots of places from next week. Other groups have worked on developing a film with Florence Corvez Curtis, photography with Chaz Snell, The Plastic Goldfish Co, and PR with Catherine Warrilow, The Rank Group. These employer interactions are so vital for the students as they progress to entering the world of work. It boosts the confidence of students when talking to employers, helps them to see the breadth of careers and begins to build a network for them.

UNIO Oxford University



Every year, Oxford's flagship access programme, <u>UNIO</u>, helps students from diverse backgrounds to make successful applications to Oxford. This has been a difficult time for all students, especially those from disadvantaged backgrounds, so we have updated UNIQ to better meet the needs of this year group. We would welcome even more applications for this year's programme from students in state schools and colleges in Oxfordshire and Milton Keynes.



This year UNIQ is offering <u>free</u> online support to 2500 UK <u>state school students</u>, starting in April and continuing for several months. UNIQ enables students to explore subjects that interest them and provides help with preparing University applications.

Students on UNIQ are guided by Oxford undergraduates through social, admissions and academic activities. In the summer UNIQ students participate in online lectures and tutorials with Oxford academics and after summer, UNIQ continues to support students as they prepare for and progress through university applications.

We have strong evidence that UNIQ works. Every year about a third of UNIQ students who apply to Oxford are offered a place. Last year all UNIQ courses were delivered 100% online and 231 of our online UNIQ students have now received offers from Oxford.

UNIQ is **open to students attending UK state schools who are applying to university next year**. Selection considers students' school grades and their socio-economic and educational background. Find out more about UNIQ at our <u>website</u>.

Trinity Talks: Beyond the Classroom, our series of subject talks by academic experts, launches on Thursday 25 February after half term, and continues through to the end of the academic year, taking place at 4pm on selected Thursdays.

For each talk, a Trinity College academic will deliver an **interactive teaching session online**, pitched at interested school/college students with an age-appropriate approach. The topics covered will be of wide interest both to those who are thinking of further study and those who are merely curious! The Access & Outreach team will also provide a **brief overview of super-curricular enrichment** and how it relates to thinking about Higher Education. Like the academic staff, we look forward to exploring Q&A from participants.

Topics and themes:

11 March: The **History** of 16th-century **Medicine** (for those interested in History and/or Medicine!)

25 March: the relevance of Medieval and Early Modern French literature to a modern reader

6 May: Introduction to Linguistics, looking at how languages change

20 May: The History of ethnic identities through Roman identity in the 10th Century

10 June: Fictional characters in late-18th-century and early-19th-century **English** theatre and what they can tell us about 'fandom' today

24 June: Molecular **Biology**: sequencing the human genome and modern assisted reproductive technologies

8 July: Chemistry: the importance of plastics in our everyday lives, the environmental challenges they present, and how to produce more environmentally-friendly plastics for the future
