Attention all higher-



rate taxpayers!

If you pay 40% or 45% tax, you are eligible for tax relief on donations to charity for which you claim gift aid.

Here is how it works:

You donate £100 to charity; they claim Gift Aid, making your donation £125. You pay 40% tax, so you can personally claim back £25.00 ($£125 \times 20\%$).

This means that when you donate, both the charity and the donor can benefit.

Donate before 6th April for the 2025-2026 Tax Year

How can I claim back donations?

You can claim the tax relief through your self-assessment tax return or by asking HMRC to adjust your tax code.
