The building of our new Chemistry Lab is in its final stages. The wall dividing the labs has now been torn down, new gas and electrical hook-ups are being installed, and we have a floor.

We are now waiting for all of the electric hook-ups to be completed, the installation of equipment like the fume cupboards and the installation of the worktops and other furniture.

IB Large Programme Uplift

The government's proposal to remove the IB large programme uplift would cut £75,000 of annual funding from the school. We are grateful to our community, especially those who wrote to their local MPs—Olly Glover, MP for Didcot and Wantage, received 70 letters from constituents, helping raise the issue's profile.

During half-term, Mrs Wood, Mrs Simpson, and an S7 student attended a Westminster Hall debate with MPs from other state schools offering the IB. The campaign continues, with many MPs committed to supporting our cause.

On the 24th of November, school leaders (including Mrs Wood), representatives from IBSCA, and Olly Glover MP, visited 10 Downing Street to deliver a letter urging the Prime Minister to reinstate funding for the International Baccalaureate diploma.

Forest School



What is Forest School?

Every week, our Year 2 classes get to attend a forest school session. Forest School is an outdoor education model which allows children to lead their own learning in a hands-on way, within a woodland or natural environment. Children learn valuable skills, like team-work, confidence, social skills, risk-taking... the list truly is endless. A trained Forest School leader guides the children in their learning, and sets up enhancements to learn new skills. I joined 2DE last term for one of their sessions to see what they thought about Forest School.

The School Fund

The school fund is an essential source of funding that supports our unique curriculum. It enables us to fund services, activities and support which would otherwise have to be cut. This support enables us to provide students with a good education, rather than a standard one. Without the school fund, we would have to reduce the hours on services like: forest school, ELSA sessions, specialist art and science technicians and more.

How much should I donate?

Our general guide is to donate £1 a day towards each child's education (so £365 pounds in a year). However, we accept donations of any amount, whether they be lower or higher. Every little bit does help! We can also claim gift aid on donations, which gives donations an uplift.

What is the difference between the school fund and capital campaign?

Essentially, the school fund pays for value added services that support or enhance our students learning, whilst the capital campaign aims to raise money to improve areas linked to our school site (for example, the chemistry lab, or surface drainage.)
