



We would like to start sowing over the next few weeks. If you would like to brainstorm ideas with us during one of our next eco club meetings, contact s.harries@europaschool.uk.


If you have any old fences we could use to prospect the flowers growing, let us know.

GENERAL SCHOOL NOTICES

- 1. THAME LANE GATE Please do not push the red button on the post to open the Thame Lane gate to let people into school during the day. The incoming person must push the buzzer on the Intercom, so Reception can assess who can come on site. Thank you for your understanding.
- 2. REMINDER Thame Lane gate is locked at 08.40 each day. Any arrivals after that time must drive to the front of the school and sign in at Reception. The Thame Lane gate opens again at 3pm each day. The Chapel/Pedestrian gate is open from 8am to 9am and again from 3pm to 6pm. Please come to Reception to sign for the code. Please do not give the code to anyone.
- 3. TOILETS AVAILABLE ON SITE FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN AT PICK UP TIME. The Schuman Hall, Tower Block and Primary Library toilets are not for parents or young children waiting to collect at the end of school. A toilet has been made available for drop off and end of school pick ups only, on the left of the small courtyard behind Reception. There is a red sign on the door.
- 4. Rehearsals are well under way for the 10th Anniversary school show. If anyone is free to help with some scenery making or costume sewing it would be really appreciated.
