LFD TESTING

Twice-weekly LFD testing - please support us by continuing to do the twice-weekly LFD Tests at home. This is proving invaluable in managing Covid-19 within secondary schools.

PROCEDURE FOR A POSITIVE PCR TEST

Please note this procedure is not the same for the whole school and follows the Department for Education (DfE) recommendations

A report of PCR confirmed case in the school - All parents in the class are told as soon as we have been made aware of the positive case. (Positive LFTs must be confirmed by PCR)

Primary - If your child is a close contact it is advisable to organise a PCR test for your child, as primary classes mix substantially we recommend that all children do a PCR test. Schools do not act as track and trace. The DfE does not recommend LFTs for primary children.

Secondary - If your child is a close contact it is advisable to organise a PCR test for your child, please ask your children who they sit next to classes and who they spend a lot of time with. All other classmates should do an LFT before they next come to school and continue to do LFTs twice a week (which they still can get from reception).

If an LFT is positive, it has to be confirmed by a PCR test within 48 hours. If you wait longer than 48 hours, you must isolate for 10 days even if the PCR comes back negative. If you do not confirm with a PCR at all, you will need to isolate for 10 days.

Anyone who had Covid can return to school 10 full days after the positive PCR test if they were asymptomatic OR 10 full days after the onset of symptoms. Anyone still suffering from a high temperature beyond the 10 days self-isolation period should continue to isolate until their temperature has returned to normal.

Every year, thousands of school age overseas students are educated at independent schools across the UK. When their school closes for half term holidays and exeat weekends, they need a great host family who will provide a home away from home.

Your entry should take the form of a letter to the FCDO Chief Economist and should be no longer than 800 words.


