Last week, Monday 1st December, a group of students of all ages visited Radley College to attend a linguistics seminar. Led by a talented linguist and author Danny Bate, the seminar focused on the origin of Indo-European languages. We got an insight into the life and process of becoming a linguist. Danny is truly inspiring and really engaged the audience.

Danny Bate is a linguist, writer, broadcaster and podcaster who is fascinated by the study of historical languages and etymology. He took his BA and MPhil degrees from the University of York and the University of Cambridge respectively, and his PhD in linguistics from the University of Edinburgh. In October 2025 he published *Why Q Needs U*, a tremendously informative and entertaining biography of the letters of the alphabet that reveals surprising stories, makes astonishing connections and unveils the very roots of the language we speak.

During the seminar, he told the students how different languages are connected and how there could've been a language before Latin. Danny Bate is very passionate about his job and influenced the students to be just as passionate about their future jobs.

To conclude, we thoroughly enjoyed this experience and feel super privileged to have been given the opportunity to attend the seminar and hope to see others in the future!

### PTA Update

#### Christmas Fete – Thank You!

A huge thank you to everyone who attended and supported the Europa School Christmas Fete! Thanks to your incredible generosity, we raised over **£13,000** to support the school – a fantastic achievement.

We are extremely grateful to all the volunteers who helped make the day such a success, particularly new parents to the school! Thank you for donating your time, expertise, creativity, and amazing cooking skills.

Special thanks also to **Notcutts** for kindly donating our beautiful Christmas tree.

#### PTA Fund Spending Update

Thanks to your continued support, the PTA has recently approved funding for a number of important projects and resources across the school:

- **30 new laptops** – £4,725
- **New marquee** to provide shade and rain cover during breaks (replacing the broken one) – £1,000
- **Signage for the Médiathèque** – £150
- **Rockalingua subscription** (for Year 1 and Year 2) – £150
- **Linguascope subscription** (for Primary and Secondary) – £396
- **Room dividers** for the SEN/Wellbeing Hub – £80
- **Contribution towards the school's three major capital projects** (Chemistry labs, drainage improvements, and an additional toilet block) – **£18,000**
- **Mobile display boards** for MYP and other project exhibitions – £1,230 *approved*
- In addition, the school will soon receive **30 refurbished second-hand laptops** from the charity **SOFEA**. Each device costs £50, and the PTA is funding the total **£1,500**. If successful, we will look into raising more money for additional laptops.

#### Capital Projects – Update

- **Chemistry Labs:** The refurbishment is now in its final stages. The school hopes to hold an official opening in **January**.
- **Drainage Project:** Playground surveying and drainage planning are underway. The project should be completed by **March**.
- **Additional Toilets:** Funds were insufficient to start this project this year so it will remain a **focus** for next year's fundraising.
