UCAS Discovery Exhibition – A Valuable Learning Experience for S6 Students



On Wednesday 23rd April, S6 students attended the UCAS Discovery Exhibition at the University of Winchester. This event provided an excellent opportunity for students to explore a wide range of post-18 options, including university courses, apprenticeships, and other training pathways.

With over 100 institutions present—including universities, colleges, and apprenticeship providers—students were able to engage directly with representatives, ask relevant questions, and gather information tailored to their interests and ambitions. Many students discovered new courses and career paths they had not previously considered.

The event also featured expert-led talks on a variety of topics, including specific subject areas and key stages of the UCAS application process. These sessions offered valuable insights and helped demystify aspects of the journey ahead, such as writing personal statements and preparing for interviews.

Students conducted themselves with maturity and enthusiasm throughout the day. The experience was both informative and inspiring, and it is expected that the knowledge gained will prove invaluable as they begin to make important decisions about their futures.
