Job Description

How Spanish is taught

Spanish is taught to students who have been taught bilingually from age 4 in primary in our L2 section, in September 2023 we will have S1 & S2 (Years 7 & 8) in this section and as it grows through the school it will fill to S7 (year 13). The Spanish teacher will be teaching language and literature to this section. literature. In addition, Spanish is offered as an L3 (taught from age 11) to all year groups. Therefore, teachers will be teaching students, from beginners to bi-lingual students. The ideal candidate would be confident teaching native Spanish speakers.

Main responsibilities:

Following the IB MYP and DP programmes teaching at all levels.

- Preparing pupils for the IB MYP & DP
- Model an inquiry approach to teaching and learning.
- Helping the Principal to establish a positive identity and inclusive ethos for the school
- Identify and adopt the most effective active, creative teaching approaches for all students in line with current best practice and the ethos of our school
- Plan, develop and implement high quality lessons within the broad, balanced and differentiated design curriculum using a variety of approaches
- Model and promote the IB learner profile



- Enjoy teaching and working in an internationally-minded environment
- Implement policies and procedures to ensure good practice
- Maintain discipline within the school
- Involve parents and carers in the life of the school

Key responsibilities:
